My name is Alice Okuku from Kakamega County, Kenya. I am a passionate disciple maker, Restoring Your Heart facilitator, and wife who loves working with women and youth. Through your generous support and the support of WDA (Worldwide Discipleship Association), **I started a pig farm that now plays a vital role in sustaining and expanding my ministry.** Currently, I have 16 pigs, including three expectant mothers and one male, as well as a permanent pig structure and a water tank that provides clean water for the animals. **This project has become a ministry tool that impacts lives in my community.**

Sustainability Measures

Pig waste is reused as manure for growing feed crops, creating a sustainable system. Regular cleaning and proper hygiene practices are maintained to prevent disease and ensure healthy growth. “The pig farm has proven to be a powerful tool for ministry, empowerment, and sustainability. I am deeply grateful to WDA for investing in this project — from providing piglets, housing, and feed to installing the water tank and offering continuous guidance.

My prayer is that this project continues to grow and open more opportunities to **serve, empower others, and glorify God** through the work of my hands.

Women’s Ministry

The pig farm serves as both a **discipleship and empowerment platform**, where visiting women learn about farming and faith. It has inspired many— especially stay-at-home mothers—to start small businesses, fostering financial independence and stronger family stability.

Youth Ministry

The farm offers **youth employment and training**, giving them income, work experience, and inspiration to start their own small businesses, promoting responsibility and entrepreneurship.



Our Water Tank

Thanks to WDA's generous support, we were able to install a water tank, making it easier to supply clean water and keep the pigs healthy. This simple upgrade also became a blessing beyond the farm — **it led to meeting Jane, who came for water, heard about Jesus, and is now part of our church family.** Glory to God!

In-Country Mission Trip

It was an honor to join Mama Mary McKeever and Willie Ruth Johnson (USA), and Dr. Cathy Cris (Kenya) on a mission trip across Kenya - through Nairobi, Nakuru, Kakamega, Busia, and Bungoma. We conducted Discipleship and RYH seminars throughout the country, but **the most emotional moment was ministering in Mathare slum, where I once grew up.** Returning there to serve and empower others was a moment of deep gratitude.

RYH in Kenya

I had the joy of introducing the Restoring Your Heart (RYH) ministry to over 500 women during a seminar organized by Impact Praise and Worship Ministry. **I'm now mentoring key leaders, among them,** who will continue guiding and supporting others. It's been refreshing to see their

passion grow! I also teach these women financial empowerment using my pig farm as a model — a beautiful way to blend faith and practical living.



Cross-Cultural Discipleship

Dr. Cathy and I were privileged to lead an RYH program for a team from **Nigeria**, in partnership with ECWA (Evangelical Church Winning All) through Pastor Akim of Nigeria. It's been a wonderful experience of faith, family, and healing, as participants gradually opened up and found freedom together. I'm also leading a group of women from **India** through a partnership with Pastor Emanuvel Dass, who has helped mobilize many wonderful women in that country — **what a blessing to see how God is connecting hearts across nations for His glory!**



More Piglets!

We now have 16 pigs on the farm — including three expectant mothers due to give birth by the end of October! Among them is Polka, our playful black-and-white pig from Malaba. Once full of energy (and a bit messy with her food), she's now calm and ready to welcome her piglets soon. As the pigs reproduce and I am able to sell some pigs while breeding others, the **proceeds will become a sustainable source of income, which will fuel the growing discipleship initiatives I am leading.**

Thank you for your ongoing prayers for me and for all of Kenya. The Lord is doing a wonderful thing. He even uses pigs.
